OTHER INSTRUCTIONS

1. Candidates should carefully fill in all the required details in the application form, including correct register number and correct subject codes, failing which their applications are liable to be rejected.
2. Candidates appearing for the first time should not fill the register number column. The University office will assign the register number. Others should fill up the register number assigned for the first year examination. Candidates must enclose attested Xerox copy of certificates in evidence of date of birth and qualifying examination passed while they apply first time for the university examinations.
3. Candidates appearing for the first time should pay their fees for the whole (year-end) examinations.
4. **BLIND CANDIDATES** : Blind candidates are exempted from payment of examination fees. They should enclose copy of medical certificate in evidence of their handicap. In column 2 of application form, write as 'Blind candidate'.
5. The fees once paid will in no circumstances be refunded or held over for the subsequent examinations.
6. The fees shall be remitted by DEMAND DRAFT, drawn in favour of "THE REGISTRAR, TAMIL NADU DR. AMBEDKAR LAW UNIVERSITY, CHENNAI."
7. All candidates appearing for the examination should forward their applications, through the Principal of the respective College, where they have undergone the course.
8. Candidates should obtain their hall tickets from the Principal of the College (Examination Centre), three days in advance of the commencement of examination, by producing relevant certificate of identity.
9. Candidates who have earned a minimum of 75% of attendance are eligible for appearing for University examinations. Candidates who have earned attendance above 66% and below 74% are eligible for appearance in the examination, provided the lack of attendance is recommended and forwarded for condonation by the respective College Principals, on payment of the prescribed fee of Rs.250/-. In other cases no candidate is eligible for appearance in the University examination.

1. Examination fees details:

- i. For each written / practical subject paper: Rs.50/-
 - ii. For statement of marks: Rs.20/-
 - iii. For issue of Provisional Certificate: Rs.100/-] for final year
 - iv. For issue of Convocation form: Rs. 20/-] students alone.
1. Candidates may apply for re-totalling of marks awarded in any subject paper for which they wrote the Examination. Fees for re-totalling of marks awarded for each subject paper is Rs.150/-.
 2. Candidates may apply for re-valuation of answer paper in any subject paper for which they wrote the Examination. Fees for re-valuation of answer paper for each subject paper is Rs.250/-.
 3. Application for re-totalling of marks awarded or for re-valuation of answer paper shall be made within 15 days from the date of publication of examination results, in the prescribed form, along with Demand Draft for the prescribed fees, through the College Principal.
 4. For a PASS in each subject paper a candidate should obtain 45% marks out of a maximum of 100 marks with effect from the academic year 1998-99.
