Order:

The Government of India, Ministry of Environment and Forests Department in the letter first read above have approved the research project on “Taxonomy Studies on family Noctuidae (Noctuoidea:Lepidoptera) from Western Ghats of India” at a total cost of Rs.12,83,170/- (Rupees Twelve Lakhs Eighty Three Thousands One Hundred and Seventy only) for a period of 3 years and released an amount of Rs.2,63,000/- (Rupees Two Lakhs Sixty Three Thousands only) as first installment of grant for 2005-06 for meeting the expenditure on the project to the Punjabi University, Patiala. The Government of India has sponsored the above project under the guidance of Dr.Jagbir singh, Department of Zoology, Punjabi University.

2. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden in his letter second read above has informed that Dr. Jagbir Singh, Principal Investigator has requested him to grant permission to carryout project work on Taxonomic Studies on the Family Noctuidae (Noctuoidea: Lepidoptera) and also to collect 5 to 6 Specimens of Noctuid moths of each species at all the Forest Divisions and Sanctuaries of Western Ghats for a period of three years for this research project. As per Section 12, of Wildlife (Protection) Amendment Act, 2002, for any wild animal not coming under Schedule I of Wildlife (Protection) Amendment Act 2002, prior permission of the State Government is required for collection of specimen. The Principal Chief Conservator of Forests & Chief Wildlife Warden has therefore requested the Government to accord permission to Tvl.Dr. Jagbir Singh-Principal Investigator, Mr.Navneet Singh-Senior Research Fellow, and Mr. Ratesh Kumar – Junior Research Fellow, Department of Zoology, Punjabi Univeristy, Patiala to collect Five to Six Specimens of Noctuid moths of each species in

all the Forest Divisions and Sanctuaries of Western Ghats for a period of three years from June 2007 to July 2009 for this research work.

3. The Government after careful examination accord permission to Dr.Jagbir Singh, Principal Investigator, Mr.Navneet Singh, Senior Research Fellow and Mr.Ratesh Kumar, Junior Research Fellow, Department of zoology, Punjabi University, Patiala to collect five to six specimens of Noctuid moths of each species in all the Forest Divisions and Sanctuaries of Western ghats for a period of three years.
