### ORDER

In the Budget Speech 2011-2012, it is stated that, a new Veterinary College will be started at Orathanadu in Thanjavur District during 2011-2012.

2. Based on the above announcement, the Registrar, Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University has sent the proposal in the letter first read above for establishment of a new Veterinary College and Research Institute at Orathanadu in Thanjavur District at a total cost of Rs.8512.75 lakhs for implementation in the years from 2011-2012 to 2015-2016 and provision of fund for required for Rs.1948.44 lakh for the year 2011-2012.

3. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Veterinary & Animal Sciences University has stated that at present, there are about 42 Veterinary Colleges in India, among which 6 are in Maharashtra, 4 in Karnataka and 5 in Andhra Pradesh. However, there are only two Veterinary Colleges in Tamil Nadu, one at Chennai (Madras Veterinary College) in Northern Region, another at Namakkal (Veterinary College and Research Institute) in Western region. There are no veterinary colleges in Delta and Southern region even though regional variations in Animal Husbandry practices are evident in the State. The Registrar, Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University has also stated that Thanjavur district is located in Cauvery delta and occupies a prominent position in agriculture of Tamil Nadu. It possesses excellent irrigation facilities and is considered to be the rice bowl of Tamil Nadu. The geographical area of the district is 3396.57 square metres. The district receives a total rainfall of 1,053 mm as against the State average of 932 mm. The major crops of the district include paddy, sugarcane and coconuts. But the district sows more than two crops only in 26.15% of the total area under the plough (54,263 Ha in 207,505 Ha), indicating that agriculture provides only seasonal labour.

4. The delta region including Trichy, Thanjavur, Nagapattinam, Pudukkottai and Tiruvarur is also renowned for its animal husbandry activities, and it provides employment directly to about 5 lakh people. The region has a bovine population of 2.1 lakh and contributes about 10.12 lakh tonnes of milk annually. The significant role of animal husbandry in the economy of the region has been well recognized by the State Government and the region has two Livestock Farms, one for cattle at Eachenkkottai

and another for buffaloes at Orthanadu. Further, Tamil Nadu Veterinary & Animal Sciences University has also a peripheral centre, Veterinary University Training and Research Centre in Thanjavur which is extending its service to the livestock and poultry farmers in that region. The region is also known for Umblachery breed of cattle, evolved by livestock breeders in the region specifically to carry out ploughing in marshy lands. Establishment of a new Veterinary College and Research Institute in the Thanjavur will help to educate and produce veterinary graduates well trained in livestock management practices of the region, undertake research on augmenting the livestock production potential in the region, extend quality scientific practices to improve productivity of cattle and other livestock and poultry and improve livestock economy.

5. The total number of seats available for admission currently at Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University are 226 of which 146 are admitted in Madras Veterinary College and 80 in Veterinary College and Research Institute, Namakkal. The total number will be increased from 226 to 260 per year and will be distributed as follows:-

After careful examination the proposal of the Registrar, Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University the Government have decided to accept to establish a New Veterinary College and Research Institute at Orathanadu in Thanjavur District. According the Government accord administration for a sum of Rs.1633.94 lakhs (Rupees one thousand six hundred and thirty three lakhs and ninety four thousand only) for the year 2011-2012.

10. The Director of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services is permitted present the bill for the above amount to the Tamil Nadu Veterinary and Animal Sciences University after obtaining necessary receipt.

11. The Director of Animal Husbandry and Veterinary Services is also directed to send necessary explanatory notes for inclusion of the above expenditure in the supplementary Estimate 2011-12, at the appropriate time.
