DIRECTORATE OF TAMIL DEVELOPMENT

Tamil is a rare combination of antiquity and modernity. **The Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma's** Government is fully committed to the growth of Tamil and implementation of Tamil as official language in the Administration.

The official language committee was established in 1957 and subsequently the Directorate of Tamil Development was created in 1968 to implement the language policy of Tamil in Administration.

Reviews

Department of Tamil Development is undertaking reviews on implementation of Tamil as official language in Administration and other related works in Government Departments and Agencies.

Official Language Seminars

Official language seminars are conducted in all districts to create awareness among the Government Staff in all

Official Language Workshops

Official language workshops are conducted every year in all districts for two days at a cost of Rs 10 lakhs.

Training on Official Language Scheme

Official language training is given to the Government staff of all Departments in Chennai by the Directorate of Tamil Development.

The officials of the Department of Tamil Development impart training in Chennai and Government Officers Training Institute, Bhavani Sagar and other departments.

Prizes For Good Drafting And Noting

To encourage the Government staff who are good at drafting and noting, prizes are given every year. Offices in the districts are categorized into four viz. district level, subordinate level, subordinate of Local Administration Department and subordinate of Autonomous Corporations. The state level offices are categorized into three viz. Departments of the

Secretariat, Head of Departments and Head Offices of Autonomous Corporations.

First prize of Rs 3,000 second prize of Rs 2000 and third prize of Rs 1000 are given in each category every year.

Incentive for Implementation of Official Language

Under this Scheme, a shield with a Certificate of Appreciation is given every year to one Head of the Department, one in the Collectorate, one in the Head office of the Government undertaking for the excellent implementation of the Official Language Scheme. Further, one district level office in each district is given a shield with a Certificate of Appreciation.

Administrative Glossary

Administrative Glossary is very essential for drafting and noting in Tamil and the same is published and supplied to all Government offices at no cost by the Department of Tamil Development.

Supplementary Glossary

In addition to Official Language Implementation, this Government has taken steps to develop Tamil and the literature by way of giving prizes to the Tamil Scholars, Authors and Publishers.

The Scheme of providing financial assistance for the publication of best books is being implemented to give encouragement for publishing the best books in Tamil.

Hon'ble Chief Minister Puratchi Thalaivi Amma has enhanced the financial assistance from Rs 25,000 to Rs 50,000 and the annual income ceiling for the financial assistance is raised to Rs 50,000 from Rs 25,000

Thirukkural Recitation

Thirukkural Recitation Scheme was implemented to encourage the students to learn ethical values from Thirukkural and enhance their memory power. A prize amount of Rs 10,000 is given to 36 students who memorize all the 1330 couplets of Thirukkural. Nationalization of Books

Outstanding books of eminent Tamil Scholars are nationalized to make them available to all. The legal heirs of Tamil Scholars are given royalty for the books.

The scheme of publishing one of the books of the Tamil Scholars among the nationalized books every year is implemented through the International Institute of Tamil Studies.

Drafting the History of Tamil Nadu

Steps have been taken to publish the History of Tamil Nadu from ancient period till date so as to enable the younger generation to know the ancient history of Tamil Nadu. Under this scheme, following volumes have been published

- Ancient period

Financial Assistance for Aged Tamil Scholars

The aged Tamil Scholars who have rendered yeoman service to Tamil are given financial Assistance under this scheme.

The Government, taking into account, the salient features and significance of the etymological dictionary have accorded sanction for the publication of Revised edition of the same in 12 volumes in an uniform and proper manner each running to 1,000 pages.

TAMIL UNIVERSITY, Thanjavur

The Tamil University, a veritable repository of Tamil literary resources, philosophy, arts and culture was founded by the then Chief Minister of Tamilnadu, Puratchi Thalaivar Bharat Rathna MGR on the eve of the birth day of Perarignar Anna on 15th September, 1981.

Pursuit of Antiquity

The University has twenty five departments which are under five Major faculties like the faculties of Arts, Manuscriptology, Developing Tamil, Language and Science. There are major research wings including of Greater Lexicon and Encyclopedias of Arts and Science, Press and Publication, Museum and Library.

Educational Works

The University is conducting MA, MSc, MPhil, PhD Courses and Diploma and Certificate courses in Science of Yoga and Music.

There are about 596 students studying in the University this Academic Year.

This university has 183 doctorate students, 302 MPhil students 144 MA & MSc students, 96 Arts under graduate students.

INSTITUTE OF ASIAN STUDIES

Objective

The Institute of Asian Studies was founded in Chennai in 1982 to study the historical contacts of the Tamils with other countries of Asia, their enriching contributions to the composite cultures of those countries, the affinities between Tamil and the other languages of Asia, similarities that exist among the literatures, cultures and civilizations in the Asian countries, the cultural lives and social problems faced by Migrant Tamil communities through multi-disciplinary comparative studies in collaboration with foreign scholars.
